

In the Lens Corrections Setup pop-up menu, what's the difference between Default, Auto & Custom?

'Auto' leaves Lightroom to search for a matching profile automatically. If it can't find a matching profile, either because the profile doesn't exist yet, or because it doesn't have enough information in the photo's EXIF data, then it will show an error saying 'Unable to locate a matching profile automatically.'

'Default' does the same, but also allows you to customize the settings for specific lenses. For example, if 'Auto' can't find a lens because it doesn't have enough information, you can select the correct profile from the pop-up menus below and save it as a default for the future. From that point on, whenever you select 'Default' for a photo with that camera/lens combination, it will apply your new default lens setting. It's also useful if you have multiple profiles for a lens—perhaps one provided by Adobe and one you've created yourself—and you want to automatically select one of those profiles.

'Custom' shows that you've manually changed the profile or one of the Amount sliders.
